At Bekaert's booth the company featured its tinting competition, which was in full swing when we arrived. According to Bekaert, the contest's winner was Dan Hillary. New this year is a range of products from clear to dark film. Bekaert's Ultra Performance film is designed for consumers who want to filter out sunlight without changing the appearance of their vehicles' windows. One of Ultra Performance's unique characteristics is its heat rejection, or solar energy (infrared light) rejection of 47 percent, substantially reducing vehicle interior heating, according to the company. Bekaert's other film included the Solar Gard Supreme line of dark window film. According to the company, the film comes in visible light transmission levels of 8, 15, 28 and 40 percent. The company said this film will block up to 99 percent of harmful UV rays and rejects up to 42 percent of incoming solar energy (heat).
